Joyce Mae Jackson, 76, of Warrensburg, passed away on Saturday, November 12, at Research Medical Center in Kansas City. Services will be held on Saturday, November 26, 2022, at 11:00 AM at Ward Memorial Baptist Church in Sedalia. Visitation will be from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM at the church. Burial will follow immediately thereafter at the Syracuse Cemetery, in Syracuse, MO. 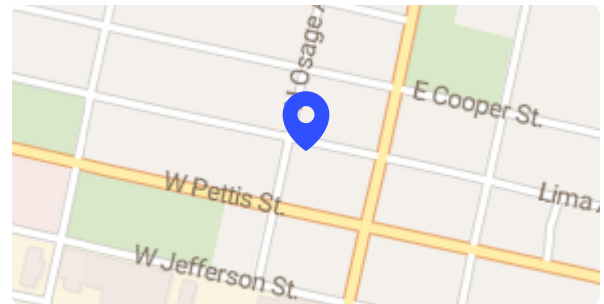

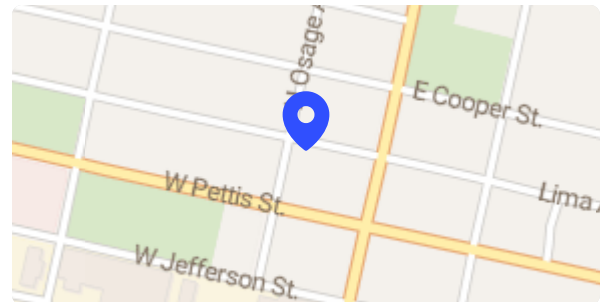

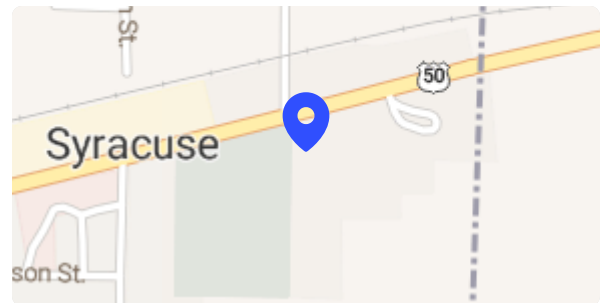
